MAIN TRUTH: GOD WANTS YOU TO UNDERSTAND HIS WILL.

 \dot{Q} Perhaps you could use this Main Truth to set the tone for your club.

SUGGESTED THINGS TO DO AS THE CHILDREN ARRIVE:

*Greet the children; take attendance, listen to previous week's memory verse. Nametags on seats.

1. OPTION ONE: Challenge the children with one or two of these riddles:

- a. Why did the Oreo go to the dentist? (Because he lost his filling)
- b. What do cakes and baseball teams have in common? (They both need a good batter)
- c. What is the most popular fish in the ocean? (The starfish)

- 7. What did David say about Goliath's threats? ("Who is this Philistine that thinks he can stand up against the armies of the living God?")
- 8. How did King Saul feel about David fighting Goliath? (He didn't think David could do it because he was too young and not trained.)
- 9. Why was David able to conquer this mighty giant? (He trusted God to give him the victory.)
- **10. What does it mean to trust in the Lord?** (You can depend on God to keep His promises you read in the Bible.)
